Florida Senate

Senate District 25 – Gayle Harrell

- Lake Okeechobee, it represents the Gateway to the Everglades and is a centerpiece for marketing outdoor adventure, agricultural, and natural beauty

Senate District 29 – Kevin J. Radar

- 39 Hotels, 5,627 rooms employing 2,900 paying \$12 million in property taxes and \$27.9 million in sales taxes
- New Hotels – Hyatt Place Boca, Fairfield Inn Wellington
- Boca Raton Resort & Club, the largest hotel in Palm Beach County
- 800 Restaurants employing 14,800 paying \$64 million in sales taxes
- Total jobs directly supported by tourism 17,700 (5% of voting population, 9% of Households)
- Total taxes directly paid by tourism \$107 million

Senate District 30 – Bobby Powell

- 103 Hotels, 11,271 rooms employing 5,900 paying \$23.8 million in property taxes and \$55.8 million in sales taxes – including our major beachfront resorts
- New hotels – Hilton Garden Inn PB Outlets, Home2 Suites PBIA, Canopy, The Ben, Amrit
- The Breakers, Hilton WPB, PGA National
- 1,700 Restaurants employing 24,000 paying \$104 million in sales taxes
- Total jobs directly supported by 28,700 (10% of voting population, 15% of Households)
- Total taxes directly paid by tourism \$183.6 million

Senate District 31 – Lori Berman

- 73 hotels 4,691 rooms employing 2,400 paying \$23 million in sales tax

- Total jobs directly supported by tourism 5,200 (4% of voting population, 9% of Households)

District 88 - Al Jacquet

- 50 Hotels, 3,984 rooms employing 1,800 paying \$4.8 million in property taxes and \$20 million in sales taxes

- 690 Restaurants employing 8,000 paying \$34 million in sales taxes

District 89 - Mike Caruso

- 90 Hotels, 9,100 rooms employing 4,900 paying \$28.5 million in property taxes and \$45.7 million in sales taxes

- The most significant collection of hotels for any house district in Palm Beach County: The Breakers, Boca Raton Resort & Club, Brazilian Court, The Chesterfield, Colony Palm Beach, Hilton Singer Island, Delray Sands, Marriott Delray Beach, Tideline, Eau Palm Beach Resort, and Four Seasons
- 870 Restaurants employing 13,700 paying \$59 million in sales taxes
- Total jobs directly supported by tourism 18,600 (14% of voting population, 24% of Households)

District 90 – Joseph Casello

- Total jobs directly supported by tourism 6,700 (6% of voting population, 10% of Households)

- Marriott at Boca Center
